### Welcome to the April BESST update for Governors!

Spring has sprung, and so we are prompted to look ahead to the Summer Term.

Summer term dates for BESST Governor Training have now been released to book on the <u>BESST webpage</u> and a summary of all the courses is attached at the end of this newsletter. The first session after Easter is the free termly **Governor Priorities update on 26**<sup>th</sup> **April**, hosted with the Bucks Association of School Governors. We strongly recommend this session, especially for Chairs of Governors and clerks to help in setting your summer term agendas. Feedback on our courses to date has been excellent, with the recent Safeguarding course receiving an **overall satisfaction rating of 9.8 (out of 10).**

#### Covid

Covid cases rose last month, and at mid-March, overall absence across Bucks was 4% (1721) of pupils absent and 9% (2862) of teachers absent along with 7.9% of support staff absent from school. These absence levels continue to present daily challenges in many schools, and as ever, we are grateful to staff, pupils and governors for your perseverance during tough times.

#### Ukraine

With the current situation in the Ukraine, Children and Young people may well have seen or heard things about the Ukraine Crisis and will want to ask questions. They may have seen images or heard something that has worried or upset them and may be giving them bad dreams. If children and young people don't have the opportunity to voice concerns or worries, they will continue looking for the information that they need to make sense of the world, possibly searching for those answers on random websites which may close their minds, reduce their resilience to extremism, and possibly even place them in danger. The Local Authority School Improvement Service have provided links to materials that may assist school staff in talking about the conflict in an age-appropriate way, to challenge assumptions, correct misinformation and protect your school's values.

At the moment, it is not clear how many families in Bucks have signed up for the homes for Ukraine' scheme; however, there is some indication of community groups putting themselves forward. This may mean we will get concentrations of families in discrete geographical areas, potentially resulting in challenging numbers for some places.

The Local Authority are putting together an information pack for sponsors as it is important to ensure support for the refugees and the host family to ensure the scheme is as successful as possible; as well as a pack for schools that will signpost how to access services.

The Local Authority has also sought assurances from the DfE that schools' engagement in supporting refugees will not be negatively viewed when considering school performance measures such as end of Key Stage testing and Ofsted inspections.

#### **BASL Conference for Headteachers**

The BASL Conference for headteachers was well received in March. The conference focussed on the 'Legacy of Lockdown – Finding the Positive Route Out' and as well as hearing from a number of excellent speakers, those who attended enjoyed networking together and learning from one another.

### BESST Training - 2022/23

For 2022/23, governing boards will be able to sign up for a package of BESST training to receive a discounted rate, or you can continue to use the training on a Pay As You Go basis. Packages will be offered for the Autumn and Spring terms initially, and thereafter we will roll out packages for the next full financial year(23/24).

Each session will be led by a local expert and courses will be live and interactive. The one-hour sessions will be focused on the needs of Buckinghamshire's governors and will allow plenty of time for questions to ensure the training meets your needs. There may be occasional training that is offered in a different format, such as face to face or lasting more than one hour, and pricing for these courses will be listed on a pay as you go arrangement only.
